# Autumn Birdwatching and Wildlife Photography

Based at Highfield Farm, Driffield East Yorkshire

2.5 days commencing on 14/10/2021



<p><b>First Day</b>  <b>Approximate times:</b>  <b>Arrival 1300</b></p> <p><b>1930-2130</b></p>	<p>Arrival at the hotel. YCN guide will meet you. A get to know your guide session, a brief talk about the itinerary discuss any changes and opportunities due to weather, birds etc. with Coffee and biscuits. This is followed by the first excursion to Top Hill Low Nature Reserve approx. 20 mins drive away. Top Hill Low is a great place for wildfowl and waders with many bird hides. Evening meal approximately 6.30pm          Evening talk by YCN. On the birdlife of the Yorkshire Coast, Wolds and North York Moors National Park</p>

Sites will be chosen based on weather; birds present the day before and clients preferences. Evening meal approximately 6.30pm          Approximate lunch break time each day; a packed lunch and drink will be provided. There will also be opportunities for café and toilet stops during the day as required.</p>
<p><b>Third Day</b>  <b>0800 – 1700</b></p>	<p>Full day birding tour, see destinations below for places we can visit and potential species. Sites will be chosen based on weather; birds present the day before and clients preferences.</p>
<p><b>Destinations can include:</b></p> <p><b>Flamborough Bird Observatory</b></p> <p><b>Filey Bird Observatory</b></p> <p><b>Spurn Bird Observatory and the Humber</b></p> <p><b>Top Hill Low</b></p> <p><b>Yorkshire Wolds</b></p> <p><b>Hornsea Mere</b></p>	<p>Based at Highfield Farm, this 2.5-day tour focuses on the wonderful diversity of bird species in East and North Yorkshire. Over 100 species of bird are possible.</p> <p>Autumn migration brings thousands of birds to our coastline from Europe, Siberia and even further! End of August and early September things start to get exciting with waders increasing in numbers. Many birds such as <b>Grey Plover</b> and <b>Black-tailed Godwit</b> still in their beautiful summer plumage. Seabirds are on the move with <b>Manx Shearwater</b> and <b>Arctic Skua</b> You never know what's could turn up such as a <b>Black-browed Albatross</b> in 2016!</p> <p>The scenic East and North Yorkshire coast is also one of the best in the country for scarce songbirds. On our autumn trips we have a fairly good chance of seeing birds such as <b>Barred Warbler</b>, <b>Red-backed Shrike</b> and <b>Yellow-browed Warbler</b>. In 2016 we enjoyed great views of many species of wader including the rare <b>Pectoral Sandpiper</b>, On the 2014 tour we saw a rare <b>Masked Shrike</b> at Spurn. Another fantastic day at Spurn in mid-September 2013 starred an amazing <b>Great Snipe</b>, while in 2012 the YCN birding tour found an <b>Arctic Warbler</b> at Flamborough!</p> <p>October sees the arrival of our wonderful winter thrushes <b>Redwing</b> and Fieldfare this is also a great month for <b>Short-eared Owls</b> and occasionally <b>Long-eared Owl</b>. On the cliff top fields <b>Snow Bunting</b> and <b>Lapland Bunting</b> can often be found. Rare birds later in the autumn include the beautiful <b>Pallas's Warbler</b> from Siberia.</p>
